

**The John S. Marten Program
in Homiletics and Liturgics
June 24-26, 2019**

I wanted to share with you my trip this week to Notre Dame in Indiana. As I write you from the airport in Newark Sunday evening, I am preparing to join 7 other priests from the Archdiocese to begin a course on preaching. Sounds odd, I know. I have been invited to participate in this preaching course as part of the *ongoing formation and education office* of the Archdiocese.

This is a one year course which has 3 days this summer and next summer to open and to close the course. In addition, there are monthly meetings of 8 priests from the Archdiocese of Newark who are in this course and we are expected to meet once a month with prepared homilies and, from what I hear, they are to be recorded on video as part of this program. As I find out more, I will continue to share with you my progress in this course. I am excited and also a bit apprehensive. It has been a few years since I was in a classroom as a student. I know this course will help me serve you, the people of Nativity better. Here is some information on the course I am taking. *Mystic and Mystagogue: Preaching as Spiritual Leadership*

A Catholic preacher is to be a shepherd and a spiritual leader. The key question in preaching is: how do we lead our people deeper into an encounter with the living God? In this conference, we will look to our roots in the Catholic spiritual tradition as a source for deepening our preaching. Together we will discuss what makes preaching thrive: how can a preacher flourish as a spiritual leader? How can we lead others into committed discipleship through preaching?

The preacher must be in some sense a mystic, one who is filled with the Lord's gracious presence and can overflow so as to lead others into that Presence. Because we are a sacramental people, the preacher must also be a mystagogue; one who can both lead the community's ritual celebrations, and help the People of God to plunge into them with lively faith, and through them touch the holy realities behind them. There is much to ponder as we refresh, renew, and encounter God in these days of this course.


Please keep me in your prayers. There is nothing more frightening like returning to school after the age of fifty.



VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM TO OPEN JUNE 15

As announced this past February, the Archdiocese of Newark along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Archdiocese. The IVCP will be open to claims beginning June 15.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Archdiocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims no matter when the abuse occurred are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

The IVCP is a continuation of the goals set out by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., in his Forward in Faith: Our Road Ahead plan for the people of the Archdiocese of Newark.

This program is a sign of our commitment to the continued healing of victims who were sexually abused as a minor by a member of our Archdiocesan clergy, said Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark. It is a genuine expression of our remorse and our desire to make amends for past transgressions, and I sincerely hope it will meaningfully assist victims and bring them a measure of peace.


